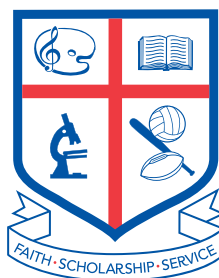

THE SCHOOL

St. Martin's Episcopal School is a co-educational, independent school located in Metairie, Louisiana, a suburb of New Orleans. The school has an ongoing commitment to provide a superior college preparatory education to all our students from prekindergarten through 12th grade. Accredited by the Independent Schools Association of the Southwest (ISAS), and approved by the Louisiana State Department of Education, St. Martin's curriculum is rigorous, with Advanced Placement and honors programs in most Upper School disciplines.

Advanced Placement Exams

In May 2011, 45 students took a total of 82 AP exams in 16 different subjects. Scores of 3 or higher were earned by 100% of examinees in Calculus AB, English Language & Composition, English Literature & Composition, French Language, Latin: Vergil, Physics B (no AP course offered), Studio Art: 2-D and 3-D, by 80% in Biology, and by 75% in European History and Macroeconomics.

GRADING SCALE

Quality Points: For the purpose of determining grade point average, honor roll, eligibility for the National Honor Society and the Cum Laude Society, the Upper School assigns quality points to the grades earned by students in all courses except Physical Education as shown below.

0.677 additional quality points are added for passing grades in Honors and Advanced Placement courses.
